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DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS:

This is a professional position in the Department of Behavioral and Community Health which involves the delivery of services to individuals with complex behavioral health and addiction related treatment needs. Responsibilities include working with a lens of integrated behavioral health and addiction related, person centered, strengths based, and trauma informed care. Additional tasks may include psychosocial and diagnostic assessment; treatment planning; individual and group therapy; crisis intervention; maintenance of electronic health records; coordination of treatment with other agencies and professionals providing ancillary services; and participation in patient discharge planning. Case assignments and supervision are provided by a higher-level administrator. This position does not supervise other employees but may direct the work of aides, interns, temporary employees and other lower-level employees. DBCH employees may be required to serve on any of the Department's standing or ad hoc committees or on community collaboration committees.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES:

The following is indicative of the level and types of activities performed by incumbents in this title. It is not meant to be all inclusive and does preclude assignment of activities not listed which could be reasonably expected to be performed by an employee in this title.

- 1. Maintains caseloads of individuals receiving behavioral health intervention;
- 2. Formulates treatment plan for individual clients and modifies treatment plan to reflect challenges or changes in treatment;
- 3. Responds to crisis situations making independent decisions and utilizing supervisory and team support as needed to address risk;
- 4. Maintains case records documenting all contacts and meetings required;
- 5. Provides psycho-education to clients, collaterals and families related to addiction and/or behavioral health issues;
- 6. Coordinates treatment with other agencies, Department of Community and Family Services (DCFS), Probation Department, etc;
- 7. May provide court-ordered forensic evaluations and make treatment recommendations;
- 8. Responds to queries from insurance companies, DCFS and other agencies concerning pertinent patient information.

FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES:

Knowledge of integrated treatment - behavioral health, addiction and recovery treatment; thorough knowledge of the factors which contribute to these complexities; ability to work effectively with professional associates; ability to compile and organize client data; ability to organize work; ability to maintain records; ability to participate in community education activities including public speaking; ability to communicate effectively both orally and in writing; personal characteristics necessary to perform the duties of the position; physical condition commensurate with the demands of the position.



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MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Licensed by the New York State Department of Education as a Licensed Clinical Social Worker, Licensed Master Social Worker, or Licensed Mental Health Counselor, at the time of application.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:

Possession of a valid driver license to operate a motor vehicle in New York State at time of application and to Maintain the position.
