### FIREFIGHTER / MECHANIC

## DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS:

This is skilled work involving responsibility for automotive and other mechanical repair tasks to fire fighting equipment and apparatus. Work is broadly outlined by a superior permitting wide leeway for planning and supervising jobs. Supervision may be exercised over the work of helpers. An employee in this position will perform fire-fighting duties and function as a firefighter when not performing mechanical work.

## **TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES:**

- 1. Locates trouble in motors and prescribes the needed repairs;
- 2. Leads in the repair of diesel and gasoline motor equipment, such as passenger automobiles, fire trucks and apparatus;
- 3. Supervises the operation of machine shop equipment such as lathes, shapers, planers, grinders, drill presses, radial drills, boring bars, key seater and other metal working machines;
- 4. Grinds valves and fits new bearings, pistons and rings;
- 5. Fits connecting rods and bearings;
- 6. Repairs or overhauls brake systems, differentials, transmissions, and front and rear axles;
- 7. Repairs and replaces water pumping equipment and other mechanical fire fighting equipment;
- 8. Instructs in the operation of complex motor equipment;
- 9. Makes estimates and prepares requisitions for materials;
- 10. Responds to fire alarms to operate pumper and/or to repair a pump engine or other equipment which may break down at the scene;
- 11. Responds to fire alarms and emergency calls with Fire Company and performs a variety of dangerous firefighting assignments;
- 12. Drives and operates motor-driven fire fighting equipment; connects hose lines and nozzles; operates volume and pressure pumps;
- 13. Raises and climbs ladders and enters burning buildings;
- 14. Makes necessary opening in burning buildings for ventilation, entrance and egress;
- 15. Removes persons from burning buildings;
- 16. Performs salvage operations at scene of fires, such as covering furniture with tarpaulins and cleaning debris;
- 17. Learns and practices new methods;
- 18. Performs miscellaneous clerical work when assigned;
- 19. Assists in giving emergency first aid treatment to injured persons;
- 20. Cleans and maintains fire fighting equipment;
- 21. Performs a variety of tasks in connection with the maintenance and repair of buildings and grounds;
- 22. Performs fire inspections for fire prevention;
- 23. Does related work as required.

# FIREFIGHTER / MECHANIC (Cont'd)

# <u>FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, ABILITIES AND PERSONAL</u> CHARACTERISTICS:

Comprehensive knowledge of the common practices, tools, terminology and accident precautions of the automotive mechanic trade; good knowledge of modern firefighting and fire prevention methods; good knowledge of NFPA 1911 standard for the inspection, maintenance, testing and retirement of in-service automotive fire apparatus; good knowledge of the maintenance and repair of fire fighting equipment, such as ladders, pumps, etc.; a special ability to work from plans and specifications and to follow rough sketches and oral instructions; ability to get along well with others; initiative; dependability; conscientiousness; good motor, hand and eye coordination; manual dexterity; physical condition commensurate with the demands of the position.

## MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Permanent competitive class status as a Firefighter and one year of skilled mechanical work experience which primarily involved the repair of automobiles and/or truck equipment.

## **SPECIAL REQUIREMENT:**

An appointing authority may require candidates to:

- 1. Become licensed at the appropriate level as a New York State Motor Vehicle Inspector.
- 2. Have an Emergency Vehicle Technician Certification Level 1 or higher.
