

## HELPLINE CRISIS COUNSELOR

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### DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS:

This is a professional clinical position in a 24/7/365 crisis counseling, information, and referral call center. The position involves telephone/texting crisis counseling and coordination of crisis intervention services to adults, adolescents, and children in emotional distress. The position includes answering crisis calls/texts and emergency bridge phones and collaborating with 911 dispatchers and law enforcement. The incumbent is also involved in assisting callers in developing safety plans, in triaging referrals to the Mobile Crisis Intervention Team, and in expediting requests for 9.45 emergency involuntary pick-up orders/coordination with the Director of Community Services and/or designee. Supervision may be exercised over subordinate staff. Employees are required to work shifts which may cover day, night, holiday, and weekend hours.

### **TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES:**

Typical work activities for incumbents in this title include those listed below in addition to those typical work activities performed by lower-level titles in the series. They are indicative of the level and types of activities performed by incumbents in this title. It is not meant to be all inclusive and does not preclude a supervisor from assigning activities not listed which could reasonably be expected to be performed by an employee in this title.

- 1. Answers calls that come into the HELPLINE call center, gathers information about the caller/situation, responds with appropriate clinical response, and logs all calls in electronic database prior to end of shift;
- 2. Coordinates with other service providers, family, emergency response, and initiates law enforcement welfare checks as necessary;
- 3. Engages in texting conversations through web-based software, completes summary in software at completion of each conversation, and may need to complete an additional electronic log if necessary to convey clinical information to contract agencies confirmed to be working with caller;
- 4. Coordinates needs of the callers that are received through 988 or the emergency bridge phones, and initiates "active rescue" with emergency dispatch and law enforcement when necessary;
- 5. Triages referrals to Mobile Crisis Intervention Team, Stabilization Center and Trauma Team for additional assessments/linkages to services and resources;
- 6. Makes referrals to appropriate community agencies (i.e. domestic violence resources) and supportive community events;
- 7. Provides general information about programs and treatment options for individuals and families and serves as an after-hours resource for individuals needing additional support at the request of the treatment provider;
- 8. Offers and completes follow-up calls that meet the clinical need.

### FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES:

Thorough knowledge of the factors which contribute to mental, emotional, and social maladjustment and of therapeutic techniques to treat those affected; good knowledge of the principles and techniques of counseling; good knowledge of personality development; knowledge of software packages for word processing to produce memos and letters; ability to organize work effectively; ability to maintain competency and to keep abreast of latest developments in the mental health field; ability to relate empathetically to a potentially difficult patient population; ability to maintain records; ability to communicate effectively, both orally and in writing to a wide variety of people; including children; ability to work as a member of a team; ability to establish satisfactory

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relationships with others; ability to work on web-based software platforms; personal characteristics necessary to perform the duties of the position; physical condition commensurate with the demands of the position.

		Education or related field plus two (2) years of paid work experience in		
		mental health or related field under professional supervision;		
OR:	(C)	Bachelor's degree in Psychology, Social Work, Mental Health Counseling,		
		Education or related field plus three (3) years of paid work experience in		
		mental health or related field under professional supervision;		
OR:	(D)	Associate's degree in Psychology, Social Work, Mental Health Counseling,		
		Education or a related field plus five (5) years of paid work experience in		
		mental health or related field under professional supervision;		
OR:	(E)	Graduation from high school or possession of a high school equivalency diploma		
		and seven (7) years of paid work experience in mental health or related field		
		under professional supervision;		
OR:	(F)	An equivalent combination of education, training and experience between the		
		limits of (A) and (E) above.		

<u>NOTE:</u> Your degree or college credit must have been awarded by a college or university accredited by a regional, national, or specialized agency recognized as an accrediting agency by the U.S. Department of Education/U.S. Secretary of Education.
