### SAFETY AND SECURITY SUPERVISOR

#### DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS:

This is an administrative and technical position involving responsibility for planning, organizing, conducting, directing and enforcing the safety and security program in a school setting. The work is performed in accordance with existing state education regulations and by developing and implementing procedures, guidelines and policies. General supervision is received from a higher-level administrative employee. Supervision is exercised over subordinate personnel.

## **TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES:**

The following is indicative of the level and types of activities performed by positions in this title. It is not meant to be all-inclusive and does not preclude a supervisor from assigning activities not listed, which could reasonably be expected to be performed by an employee in this title.

- 1. Develops, organizes, directs and enforces a comprehensive safety program in accordance with agency regulations and standards;
- 2. Coordinates and trains all school safety personnel;
- 3. Establishes and maintains favorable working relationships local police agencies;
- 4. Works with faculty and administration to insure adequate campus safety and security;
- 5. Makes regular inspections of all buildings, noting safety and security deficiencies; takes corrective action to insure compliance with acceptable standards;
- 6. Develops and conducts training programs related to safety and security, which may include initiating building level safety teams;
- 7. Maintains records and prepares reports as required;
- 8. Initiates building-wide strategies for crisis response plan;
- 9. Coordinates district-wide staff training on school safety and security with the New York Center for School Safety.

#### FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES:

Knowledge of the principles and practices of operating a large-scale safety and security program;

Knowledge of pertinent safety and security regulations;

Ability to develop and carry out a comprehensive safety and loss control program;

Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with others;

Ability to communicate effectively both orally and in writing;

Ability to work independently;

Ability to organize work effectively;

Personal characteristics necessary to perform the duties of the position;

Physical condition commensurate with the demands of the position.

## SAFETY AND SECURITY SUPERVISOR (Cont'd)

# **MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:**

Graduation from high school or possession of a high school equivalency diploma and:

EITHER: (A) A Bachelor's degree and six years of full-time paid experience in developing or

administering safety and security programs in a school setting or youth facility;

OR: (B) Ten years of full-time paid experience in developing and/or administering safety

and security programs in a school setting or youth facility;

OR: (C) An equivalent combination of training and experience.

## **SPECIAL REQUIREMENT:**

A department head may require the possession of a valid New York Driver License at the time of appointment.

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
