**DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS:**

This is a highly responsible position involving the performance of skilled work in the repair, overhaul, and maintenance of automotive vehicles and requiring the exercise of supervisory responsibilities. This class is distinguished from Automotive Mechanic by the supervisory responsibility. Although the skill level may be equivalent to a Head Automotive Mechanic, the supervisory responsibility is lower. Work is performed under general direction and supervision is exercised over the work of others.

**TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES:**

The following is indicative of the level and types of activities performed by incumbents in this title. It is not meant to be all inclusive and does not preclude a supervisor from assigning activities not listed which could reasonably be expected to be performed by an employee in this title.

1. Leads and participates in the repair and maintenance of automotive equipment;
2. Grinds valves and fits new bearings, pistons and rings;
3. Repairs and overhauls brake systems, transmissions, front and rear axles;
4. Supervises and assigns work to mechanics either on a shift as the shift leader, or as a group leader in a large shop;
5. Inspects and reviews repair work that has been completed;
6. Maintains as necessary, a variety of records on repairs performed, hours worked, parts ordered and used and additional needed maintenance;
7. Makes estimates and prepares requisitions for materials;
8. May schedule and perform required periodic inspections of vehicles;
9. May keep payroll records and time sheets;
10. Participates in snow and ice control activities;
11. May perform bulk petroleum fuel storage record keeping (daily/weekly/monthly/annual reporting) when Automotive Service Center Supervisor is absent from work.

**FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES:**

Thorough knowledge of automotive mechanics, repair methods, tools, terminology and accident precautions of the trade; ability to work from plans and specifications; ability to follow oral and written instructions; ability to supervise others and secure their cooperation; personal characteristics necessary to perform the duties of the position; physical condition commensurate with the demands of the position.

**MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:**

- EITHER: (A) Associate's degree in Automotive Mechanics, Automotive Technology or related field and one (1) year of experience performing skilled automotive repair work;
- OR: (B) Three (3) years of experience performing skilled automotive repair work;
- OR: (C) An equivalent combination of education, and experience between the limits of (A) and (B) above.
