GARAGE SUPERVISOR

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS:

This is important supervisory and administrative work in charge of a Public Works or Highway Department garage. The incumbent assumes responsibility for directing the repair, maintenance and modification of a variety of motor equipment to assure proper, safe and economical usage. The work is performed under general supervision of a higher level administrative employee. Supervision is exercised over subordinate mechanics and other personnel.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES:

- 1. Supervises the repair and maintenance of a variety of motor equipment such as trucks, tractors, graders, shovels, crushers, etc;
- 2. Lays out work and may assist in repairs;
- 3. Supervises the mounting, dismounting, maintenance and storage of snowplows;
- 4 Requisitions all parts and material needed in the repair and maintenance of the various equipment;
- 5. Trains equipment operators on new equipment and service;
- 6. Keeps parts and maintenance records;
- 7. Assists in writing specifications and bids for new equipment;
- 8. Assists in the preparation of the division's budget and recommendations for capital equipment purchases;
- 9. Oversees the maintenance of records relating to employee usage and equipment maintenance and repair;
- 10. Coordinates and reviews work contracted to facilitate emergency repairs to garage facilities and construction equipment:
- 11. Does related work as required.

<u>FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, ABILITIES AND PERSONAL</u> CHARACTERISTICS:

Thorough knowledge of automotive mechanics, repair methods, tools, and terminology; thorough knowledge of accepted safety practices and Department of Motor Vehicles and OSHA standards for the trade; ability to plan, supervise and inspect the work of others; ability to communicate, both orally and in writing; ability to keep records on parts usage, equipment repair and employee usage; ability to diagnose construction equipment problems and to effect safe and efficient repairs; ability to work from plans and specifications; tact in dealing with subordinates; initiative and resourcefulness in the solution of particular problems; dependability; good judgment; manual dexterity; good hand and eye coordination; physical condition commensurate with the demands of the position.

GARAGE SUPERVISOR (Cont'd)

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

High school graduation and five (5) years of progressively responsible experience as an automotive mechanic, one year of which included experience on large trucks and other construction equipment; or an equivalent combination of training and experience.

<u>NOTE</u>: Courses in automotive mechanics and repair may be substituted for a maximum of two years of experience on a year-for-year basis.
